RESPONDING TO A COMPLAINT ABOUT A REFUSAL TO GRANT A FEE WAIVER UNDER THE FREEDOM OF INFORMATION AND PROTECTION OF PRIVACY ACT (FIPPA)

Under FIPPA (subsection 59(1)), an applicant has a right to make an access complaint to the Ombudsman about any decision, act or failure to act by a public body that relates to the request. This includes a complaint about a refusal to grant a fee waiver. This Practice Note has been prepared to assist public bodies in responding to this type of complaint.

When Manitoba Ombudsman investigates a complaint concerning a refusal to grant a fee waiver, information would be requested from the public body about the complaint. There is certain information that would be relevant to any complaint about a refusal to grant a fee waiver, which is outlined below. There could be other information relevant to a particular complaint that may also be requested from a public body.

For a complaint about a refusal to grant a fee waiver, a public body would be asked by our office to:

- 1. provide a copy of the application for access
- 2. indicate the date the application was received
- 3. provide a copy of public body's correspondence with the applicant about the fees (such as an Estimate of Costs and letter concerning the fee estimate)
- 4. provide a copy of the applicant's request for a fee waiver, if this was in writing, or describe the request
- 5. provide a copy of the public body's written decision under subsection 9(2) of the Access and Privacy Regulation
- 6. explain why the public body refused to waive all or part of the fees
- 7. if the public body was not satisfied that any of the provisions in subsection 9(1) was applicable, explain why
- 8. if the public body was satisfied that one of the provisions in subsection 9(1) was applicable, explain why the public body chose to exercise its discretion to not waive the fees
